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# ACCESS Regional Food Bank Warehouse Relocating to Larger Facility

**Medford, March 15.** ACCESS is proud to announce that its Regional Food Bank warehouse will be moving to a larger facility. The new warehouse will be located at Space LLC, 2195 Joseph St. in Medford. The new warehouse will double the space capacity for handling and distributing food throughout Jackson County.

For the past three years, ACCESS has been operating above capacity in its current warehouse. Optimally, warehouses should operate at 80%. However, ACCESS has been operating at about 120% capacity with food overflowing into a tractor-trailer in the parking lot and to an offsite storage unit. At only 5,000 square feet, ACCESS has the smallest warehouse in the state relative to the amount of food they distribute and the number of people who rely on them annually.

"We stepped back after the pandemic and the wildfires to assess if our current warehouse could adequately continue to meet this community's needs," says Carrie Borgen, ACCESS Executive Director, "With 1 in 5 residents relying on our food bank annually, the need to increase our capacity was clear."

Over the past five years, ACCESS has seen the need for food almost double. Last year, 45,618 people received food through its food pantries compared to 2018 when 26,682 people were served. Last year, ACCESS experienced an 70% increase in the number of visits to our pantries due to rising inflation. This trend has continued into 2023, with January 2023 seeing the highest number of food pantry visits ever in their history. That month more than 10,000 people visited an ACCESS food pantry. Further, with SNAP benefits being reduced to pre-pandemic levels effective March 1, the need for food assistance is expected to only increase.

"Because our current warehouse is so undersized, ACCESS also loses tens of thousands of dollars' worth of free, donated food a year that we could be getting from local producers because we don't have the space to always accept it. The new space will allow for us to accept all donated food and get it onto the tables of those who need it most," says Marcee Champion, Food Programs Director.

The new warehouse will have a 9,800 sq ft dry storage space for nonperishable food items, a 1,000 sq ft freezer, and a 1,000 sq ft cooler. Additionally, the new location will have a volunteer repack area that is separate from the active warehouse space and there will be two truck docks that any size semi-truck can dock to.

As the Regional Food Bank for Jackson County, ACCESS is the lead agency to provide food and drinking water to this community in disaster situations, such as fires, earthquakes, and pandemics. The new warehouse will allow ACCESS to establish an emergency stock of food and water for the County so they can effectively respond in a disaster situation.

ACCESS anticipates being in the new space in July 2023.
